ZONAL PUBLIC HEARING

A Two Day South East Zonal Public Hearing on the Proposed Alteration to the provisions of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999; On Gender Equity/ Increased Participation of Women and Vulnerable Groups in Governance held on the 26th and 27th of May, 2021 in Enugu State- Nigeria.

Present at this hearing were the Governor of Enugu state HON. Ifeanyi Ugwuanyi, The Speaker RT. HON Uchenna Ubosi, and Senator Omo Ovie Agege among other Honorable members of Enugu, Anambra and Ebonyi State, as well as Representatives from Civil Society Organizations and other concerned sectors of the country.

Organizations from the Women's Voice and Leadership (WVL) project which is Sponsored by **Global Affairs Canada** and Supported by **ActionAid Nigeria** in Enugu State comprising of Women Empowerment Education and Peace Building Initiative (WEPBI) duly represented by the Executive Director, Oguadimma Ijeoma Joy; Miriam Menkiti, of Women Information Network and Professor Joy Ngozi Ezeilo of Women Aid Collective; established their presence and spoke in defense of the motion for Gender Equity/ Increased Women Participation in Politics.

Other Organizations present at the hearing were, Empowerment Inclusion Network, Parent and Child Care Intervention, Yiaga Africa, Persons Living with Disability (PLDs) group, Religious Organizations like the Judaism group, Christian Women Organizations (CWO) and various governmental sectors like the Nigerian Police Force (NPF), Nigerian Society of Engineers (NSE), Nigerian Labor Congress (NLC), Nigerian Lawyers Association and other State Youth Association comprising of Enugu, Ebonyi and Anambra.
