INTERNATIONAL DAY OF RURAL WOMEN



In commemoration of the International Day of Rural Women with the theme: Rural Women Cultivating Good Food for All, Women Empowerment Education and Peace Building Initiative celebrated the Women of Ndeabor community in Aninri Local Government Area of Enugu State with special recognition for their agricultural input in this Covid-19 era.

The women's farms which were physically visited proved that they produce variety of food ranging from rice, cassava, yam, potato, black beans, varieties of vegetable. The women equally engage in livestock farming for the production of meat which cuts across poultry, piggery and so on.

Noting their contribution to feeding the community and the nation, the women-farmers explained that their farming is in very large scale and their produce are not only for household consumption for also supplied to their community markets and nearby communities and states markets.

These claims were on the spot confirmed by WEPBI as the team together with the women visited a few farms which were close to their settlements. The team were marveled at the size of farmland tilled by these women for the



provision of food for all. The farms visited were a massive rice farm, two cassava farms and a poultry farm. The enormous size of these farms could not allow for a round trip on the farms. Most of these women make a living out of their farm practices and also train their children in schools from the proceeds. The women pointed out that the farms visited were not the major farms as those were only the ones with easy and quicker access.

WEPBI commended the effort of these women and encouraged them to keep up with their good works citing that there is dignity in labour.

The inaugurated women expressed their profound gratitude to Igwe Ambrose for considering them

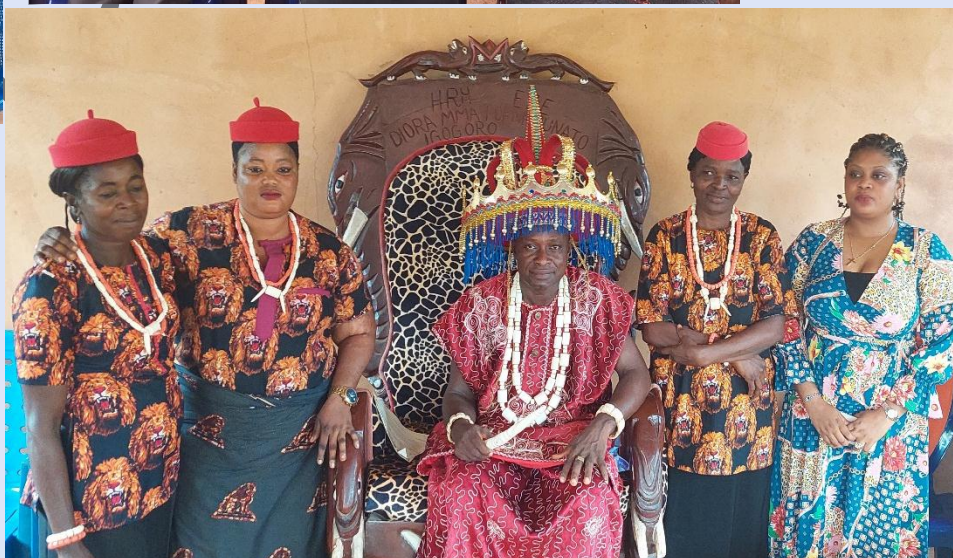
compliance with the constitution and traditions of the land.
