The Need for Women Empowerment in Prevailing Economic Realities in Nigeria

There are a number of ways that the gap can be bridged. One key solution is to improve women's access to education, which would help to increase their economic participation and empowerment

Another important solution is to promote economic diversification in Nigeria, which would create more opportunities for women and help to improve their economic status.

Additionally, it is important to address the gender inequalities in wages, access to credit, and ownership of assets. This can be done through policies such as equal pay for equal work, financial literacy programs, and increased access to microfinance. According to the World Bank, women in Nigeria have lower levels of economic participation than men, with only 37% of women participating in the labor force compared to 76% of men. Women also earn less than men, with the gender pay gap in Nigeria being 31%. In terms of asset ownership, women own only 15% of land in Nigeria, and only 20% of women have access to financial services. These statistics show that there is a clear need for policies and initiatives that promote women's economic empowerment in Nigeria.
