Recently, WEPBI visited some secondary schools to distribute sanitary pads to young girls as part of our One Girl One Pad Initiative. The visit was filled with smiles, gratitude, and relief, reminding us that access to something as simple as a sanitary pad can make a world of difference in a girl's life.

The One Girl One Pad Initiative was created to tackle the challenges many girls face in managing their periods, particularly in rural communities. Lack of access to sanitary products often forces girls to miss classes, endure stigma, or compromise their health. Through this program, WEPBI has so far reached over 5,000 young girls with both sanitary pads and essential menstrual hygiene education..

By giving the girls sanitary pads and teaching them about menstrual health, the outreach helped them manage their periods safely and with dignity. It also gave them a safe space to ask questions, clear their doubts, and feel more confident about their bodies
